CEDA Dredging Days 2017

Successful event provides far-reaching benefits

Over 200 members of the dredging community from 18 countries and 76 companies/organizations gathered at Ahoy Rotterdam, in the Netherlands, November 2017, for CEDA Dredging Days, the primary dredging

event in the EMEA region. The dredging professionals who attended represented the entire cross-section of the field. The young, established and expert, all assembled to exchange the latest ideas, knowledge and best practice, at a packed event. In keeping with CEDA's remit, papers were of a high technical level however the event wasn't "all work and no play". There was reportedly a great atmosphere and there were plenty of opportunities for delegates to network with their peers.

Entitled "*Sustainable dredging – continued benefits*", the conference focused on dredging solutions that create essential infrastructure whilst also minimizing the negative impacts on the natural and societal environment. Solutions discussed were notable for generating

additional value for nature and society. This was in perfect harmony with the ambitions of the new CEDA/IADC book, publishing in 2018, which was introduced at the conference.

The core of the technical program were the 20 peer-reviewed technical papers grouped into five sessions on: Environment and monitoring; Developments in instrumentation; Sustainable working methods and equipment; and Innovative solutions. The fifth, the academic session, included scientific papers on a range of subjects. Many of the papers were written by mixed teams of specialists, quite often as a result of different companies and countries working together.



A dredging exhibition complemented the programme of the technical sessions and the busy exhibition floor was the place where everyone mingled during the session breaks or simply relaxed with a coffee. This was also the scene for the popular CEDA-NL reception and the farewell drink on the last day. Cosy and friendly..... it was an ideal place to talk business, make new friends and re-connect with old ones.

During this year's pre-event technical visit to the Princess Beatrix Lock construction site, participants had the opportunity to see the largest monumental inland waterway lock in the Netherlands, at close quarters, as it underwent major expansion.

The technical sessions, dredging exhibition and the popular CEDA-Netherlands Reception, all combined to make it a successful event that will have far-reaching benefits for the industry.
