

Dr. Ram Mohan Elected as ASCE “Fellow”



Dr. Ram Mohan, a Senior Partner at Anchor QEA, was recently elected as a Fellow of the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE). Only about 3% of the 125,000 members of ASCE are elected into the Fellow category, and it is a recognition of long standing contributions to the civil engineering profession.

Dr. Mohan is an internationally recognized expert in coastal and marine engineering, and currently also serves as the President of the Western Dredging Association (WEDA), and Chairman of the World

Organization of Dredging Associations (WODA). In 2005, Western Dredging Association (WEDA) named him its “Dredger of the Year.”

Author of over 250 publications, some of Dr. Mohan’s contributions has led to significant advancement in the industry, including development of the in-lieu river restoration concept, wetland restoration and living shoreline designs, sea level rise and coastal adaptation planning, and cost-effective and environmentally protective aquatic remediation approaches. A member of ASCE since 1988, he has served on numerous committees, including the National Research Council (NRC) Ocean Studies Board (OSB).

Dr. Mohan’s professional experience includes planning and design studies, technical reviews and evaluations, and project management for a variety of clients in the areas of coastal and water resources engineering, environmental planning, and port development. Recently appointed as the Chief Editor of Journal of Marine Environmental Engineering, he has been lecturing at the Texas A&M University’s Center for Dredging Studies since 1995, and has taught civil engineering courses at the Johns Hopkins Whiting School of Engineering.

Dr. Mohan has been a member of WEDA since 1992 and has been serving as an Industry advisor to World Dredging, Mining and Construction Magazine since 2005.
